

Get your motorhome ready for winter camping:

With your Malibu motorhome, you can hit the road at any time, even in winter. However, we have put together a list of things you should bear in mind before setting off on your tour in colder outside temperatures:

\bigcirc	Check the heating, boiler and fan in good time before setting off.		
\bigcirc	Check the condition of the glow plugs. It is best to exchange them sentence by sentence.		
\bigcirc	Check the functionality of the lighting, including the parking lights.		
\bigcirc	Care for door and window rubbers with rubber care products without solvents (Vaseline).		
\bigcirc	Check whether all technical inspection stickers (TÜV, AU, gas) are still valid.		
\bigcirc	Top up the engine and windscreen antifreeze, oil and brake fluid.		
\bigcirc	Use windscreen antifreeze, which should be suitable down to at least minus 25 degrees.		
\bigcirc	Lubricate the lifting supports with salt water-resistant winch grease.		
\bigcirc	Seal the wheel arches and parts of the frame with underbody wax.		
\bigcirc	Wash your vehicle, seal it and allow it to dry thoroughly.		
\bigcirc	Replace windscreen wiper rubbers.		
\bigcirc	Check the starter and on-board battery. If a white layer is visible on the poles, clean the poles and coat them with pole grease. Check the screw contacts for tightness. Even with maintenance-free wet batteries you should always check the fluid level and top up with distilled water if necessary.		
hat you should always have with you in winter:			
\bigcirc	Torch and jumper cable	\bigcirc	Ice scraper, de-icing spray for door locks
\bigcirc	Snow chains	\bigcirc	Warm work gloves
\bigcirc	Snow shovel and broom	\bigcirc	Coarse sand or salt as a traction aid
\bigcirc	Replacement bulb	\bigcirc	Ladder for clearing snow and ice from the roof
\bigcirc	Wooden planks that prevent the lifting supports and tyres from sinking in during		



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
